KG & Lucas have recently made SA & the world stand up and take notice.



Kgothatso Montjane and Lucas Sithole were named SASCOC Sportspersons of the Year, 2010 in the disabled category, at a ceremony held at Sun City on Sunday, 21 August, 2011. Montjane was judged against a tough line up, with athletes like Natalie du Toit and fellow swimmer Emily Gray also in the running. Sithole was up against equally stiff competition with track and field athlete, Hilton I angenhoven and sprinter Samkelo Radebe vvina for the title.

Lucas, has now truly made his mark in the quad division of wheelchair tennis, Besides being nominated by the Mail & Guardian as one of South Africa's top 200 influential men in the Sport's division in 2011 and winning the 'disabled sportsperson of the year 2010' Gauteng Sports Awards, Lucas has now broken into the top 10 players in the world – our first athlete to break into the top 10 in the world.

Kgothatso has an equal number of awards and impressive performances for 2011. She was runner up in the 'disabled sportsperson of the year 2010' Gauteng Sports Awards, has beaten 3 top 10 players this year, and is now ranked an impressive in the world.

We are so proud of the two players- they are the first WTSA players to break in the top 10 internationally, receive awards for their national performance vs other disabled sports, and are sounding a warning bell for all- Watch out for us – WTSA means business.



WTSA HOSTS SUCESSFUL ITF WORLD TEAM CUP



WTSA welcomed 34 nations, 64 teams and over 350 participants to Pretoria from 25 April- 1 May.

The event was hosted at the University of Pretoria and had the top players in the world battling it out for national honour.

SA achieved a first for the events in many respects:

- > First time it was hosted on African Soil
- First time physically disabled lines officials and umpires were used
- First time the volunteers and majority of the workers at the event were from the wheelchair tennis programmes and centres
- > First time the event had TV coverage and live TV footage

SA can also be proud that it was a **first time we received a medal – the**Open Men's Team won Bronze in World Group II

The team consisted of Sydwell Mathonsi, Evans Maripa, Marshall Marsh, & coach Gerald Stoffberg.
